The Metro lines, FGC rail services and TRAM lines will continue to run until 2 am this weekend

- The public transport service in the Barcelona area will operate until **2 am on both Friday and Saturday** this coming weekend (28 and 29 January).
- This timetable is expected to be maintained on Saturday nights and the days before public holidays until the end of the restrictions affecting the closure of nighttime leisure venues
- The AMB NitBus service and the night buses run by the Catalan Government will stick to their usual timetables

Barcelona, 27 January 2022.- Due to the Government's extension for at least another week of the restrictions affecting the closure of night-time leisure venues, in order to control the COVID-19 pandemic, public transport in the Barcelona area will maintain its adapted timetables for as long as these measures remain in force. This was decided by the ATM, at the request of the consortium's administrative bodies and the main public transport operators.

Night bus

The AMB NitBus service and the night buses run by the Catalan Government will stick to their usual timetables.
